

Stone commemorating the Bar Confederates in Bobrek

For some years Mr. Józef Janeczko, a sightseeing expert, history enthusiast, along with the group of young enthusiasts of the past has been looking for, once existing in a park in Bobrek, the stone commemorating the Bar Confederates.

He writes:

'It was in the 80s, I had received an interesting piece of information from Stanisław Wirgiński, which fascinated me. He told me, in the village of Bobrek, on the premises of Sapieha's family park there is a monument dedicated to the Bar Confederates with an engraved date 1768-1772. The information, from the same source, about the horse monument turned out to be true. Bobrek at the time was a part of the Republic of Cracow, so it is plausible that the stone does exist. It was supposedly put on the edge of one of the canals, the old ramparts dug by the Bar Confederates. I think it is right there, so we should look / ... and so we're looking for it!!!'

We encourage the residents to look into the past. All the traces, memoirs or any notes about the missing stone will be invaluable for our community.
